

ASK PRESIDENT TO SAVE ARMENIANS

National Council of Congrega- tionalists Pass Resolu- tion on Atrocities.

New Haven, Conn., Oct. 26.—A plea to President Wilson to do everything in his power to save the remnants of the Armenian and other non-Mohammedan races in Turkey was made by the National Council of the Congregational churches today.

A resolution on this subject adopted by the council reads:

"Resolved, That the National Council of Congregational churches of the United States assembled, profoundly moved by the unquestionable evidence of unprecedented atrocities committed upon the non-Mohammedan population of Turkey by order of the central government raises its voice in protest and urges upon the president of the United States to do all in his power to save the remnants of those stricken and to secure in this endeavor the co-operation of all neutral nations."

The resolution was submitted after the Rev. James P. McNaughton of Bardizag had described the frightful slaughters which he said had taken place in the Turkish mission field.
