TURKS BURN TOWN AND MASSACRE ARMENIANS

LONDON, Sept. 2.—A dispatch to the Exchange agency from Athens says: "Travelers arriving from Constantinople announce that on Friday last Turks burned the town of Ismid and massacred a large number of the Armenian inhabitants."

Ismid lies at the head of the Gulf of Ismid, in Asia minor, about 56 miles southeast of Constantinople. It has been the residence of both Greek and Armenian archbishops. Its population is about 25,000.
